- •At-home maintenance: Replacing filters, keeping vents clear, keeping outdoor units free of yard waste and debris, and inspecting your corner flame to ensure its blue will keep your furnace healthy.

When they are there, they will clean components, check for cracks and leaks, clean components, check ventilation and other safety features, and perform amp-draw tests to examine electrical conditions.
